

# Conservation of the Orange-breasted Falcon- Adventures in Central America Species Restoration with Jay Tuttle



The Orange-breasted Falcon is a medium sized raptor which once ranged from Mexico to Argentina. Thought by some to occupy the ecological role of the iconic Peregrine in the neotropics, its range has been significantly reduced.

The Peregrine Fund has been working to conserve the species since 1991 through monitoring of local populations and captive breeding.

Jay Tuttle is a student at Utah State University working towards his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine. He will speak and share photographs of the work that the Peregrine Fund performs as part of its Orange-breasted Falcon conservation program in Belize.
